Rutgers Law School is an approved New Jersey (418) and Pennsylvania (824) continuing legal education provider. If they fulfill all CLE requirements, Rutgers Law School will issue certificates of attendance for New Jersey and New York and submit attendance for Pennsylvania attorneys within 30 days of the program.

CLE Materials: Thorough, high-quality, and carefully written materials shall be distributed to all attendees electronically before or at the program.

Format: Faculty in room with participants.
