This program is intended to explore developing the core values and professional identities in the legal profession. The program will focus on the nature and challenges facing the legal profession in a time of significant change, strategies for reflection upon and shaping a professional path based on deeper understandings of each attorney's personal and professional identities, and how attorney's personal values (along with professional values) can shape future trajectories. The program will also explore how mentors, supervisors and faculty can assist attorneys or future attorneys in developing core values and professional identities.

Faculty:

Judith Wegner, long-time member of the Carolina Law faculty, Professor Wegner served as its dean from 1989 to 1999. In 1995, while dean, she also was the President of the American Association of Law Schools, also known as the AALS. During the mid-2000's, she used a research leave to serve as a senior scholar at the Carnegie Foundation for the Advancement of Teaching. There she was the principal investigator for the Foundation's major study on legal education, part of its "Program on Preparation for the Professions."
