#### CLE INFORMATION

Rutgers Law School is an approved New Jersey and Pennsylvania continuing legal education provider. In addition, this program qualifies for New York CLE credit pursuant to the Approved Jurisdiction policy.

**NJ CLE Information:** This program has been approved by the Board on Continuing Legal Education of the Supreme Court of New Jersey for 1.5 hours of total CLE credit. Of these, 1.5 qualify as hours of credit for diversity, inclusion and elimination of bias.

**NY CLE Information:** This program qualifies for New York CLE credit pursuant to the <u>Approved</u> <u>Jurisdiction Policy</u>. This non-transitional continuing legal education program qualifies for a maximum of 1.5 credit hours, of which 1.5 credit hours can be applied toward diversity, inclusion and elimination of bias requirement. New York attorneys must view the entire program to receive CLE credit.
